
A Message from Former Councillor Ian Williams

Surveying Views



Our surveys consistently ranked access to public transport and overflow of nuisance parking as top issues for local people, with missing bus stops and reliance on electronic methods of reporting problems posing a challenge.

Ensuring Quality Public Transport



In September, the 25 night bus to UEA returned, providing cheap and safe late-night travel. Our motion supporting calling for it had passed unanimously.



In December, First rerouted the 25 away from South Park Avenue, but didn't inform residents. Cllr Lubbock made sure all affected stops had warning signs for the duration.

Empty Houses



We were contacted about council houses on Harbord Rd & the Avenues which had been empty for years.



We've been investigating carelessness by council contractors which led to verges and trees being damaged on the Avenues.
